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Parent's or Guardian's Informed Consent/ Assent Form for Department Pool Participants Earning Credit

Your child, _____, is invited to take part in a study named *Abilities*. The study is designed to learn more about how abilities differ on different psychological tasks. It is being conducted by Dr. David Amodio, who is the principal investigator, as part of faculty research.

If you give permission for your child to be in this study, your child will be asked to: 1) perform several computer tasks involving quick responses to different objects and pictures, 2) complete a set of short questionnaires, and 3) write a brief paragraph on a pre-assigned topic. We may also measure your child's skin responses with small sensors attached to your hand. Your child's participation will take about one hour, and your child will receive 1 credits. When your child completes the study, a thorough verbal and written explanation of it will be provided that you may ask to see.

There are no known risks associated with your child's participation in this research beyond those of everyday life. Although your child will receive no direct benefits for participation in this study, it may make your child more aware of how knowledge is discovered in psychology and help the investigator better understand how basic psychological processes are related to abilities.

Taking part in this study is voluntary. Not taking part or withdrawing after the study has begun will not affect your child's grade or academic standing in any way. If your child withdraws at any time, your child will still receive the 1 credit offered for taking part. Your child has the right to skip or not answer any questions your child prefers not to answer.

Confidentiality of your child's research records will be strictly maintained by assigning unique, confidential identification number codes to your child's responses. Your child's responses will not be associated with your child's name, and will be pooled with the responses of other participants for analysis.
