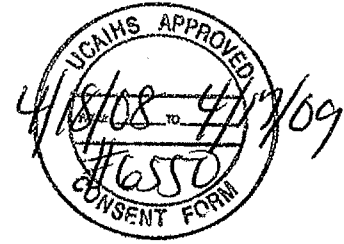

Parental Permission Form for Department Pool Participants Earning Money

Your child, _____, is invited to take part in a study named Category Estimation (2-day). The study is designed to learn more about how people learn and use categories. It is being conducted by Harlan D. Harris, who is the principal investigator, as part of his post-doctoral research studies. The faculty sponsor of this work is Professor Gregory Murphy, Psychology.

If you give your permission for your child to be in this study, he/she will be asked to learn to categorize simple visual stimuli presented on a computer screen, and then to recreate those stimuli from memory. Your child's participation will take place in two sessions of about one hour each. Your child will be paid \$20 for completing this study. When your child completes the study, a thorough verbal and written explanation of it will be provided to him or her.

There are no known risks associated with your child's participation in this research beyond those of everyday life. Although your child will receive no direct benefits for participation in this study, it may make him or her more aware of how knowledge is discovered in psychology and help the investigator better understand how categories affect representations.

Taking part in this study is voluntary. Not taking part or withdrawing after the study has begun will not affect your child's grade or academic standing in any way. If your child withdraws at any time, only partial payment, prorated on the amount of the experiment you completed, will be given. Your child has the right to skip or not answer any questions he or she prefers not to answer.

Confidentiality of your child's research records will be strictly maintained. No personal or private information will be collected about him/her. Your child's name will not be associated with the data at any time.
