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Parental/Guardian Permission Form for Department Pool Participants Earning Credit

Your child, _____, is invited to take part in a study named Environmental Attitudes and Behaviors. The study is designed to learn more about people's attitudes on our natural and societal environments. It is being conducted by Su-Anne Huang who is the principal investigator, as part of her undergraduate honors research. The faculty sponsor of this work is Professor John T. Jost and Irina Feygina, Psychology Department.

If you give permission for your child to be in this study, he/she will be asked to write several brief responses to a set of questions that we will provide your child with, and complete a few questionnaires that ask your child reflect on several issues related to his/her opinions about our society. Your child's participation will take about 1 hour, and he or she will receive 1 hour of credit for laboratory participation towards the course research requirement. When your child completes the study, a thorough verbal and written explanation of it will be given to him/her.

There are no known risks associated with child's participation in this research beyond those of everyday life. Although your child will receive no direct benefits for participation in this study, it may make him or her more aware of how knowledge is discovered in psychology and help the investigator better understand people's attitudes and behaviors about their world.

Taking part in this study is voluntary. Not taking part or withdrawing after the study has begun will not affect your child's grade or academic standing in any way. If your child withdraws at any time, he or she will still receive the 1 hour of credit offered for taking part. Your child has the right to skip or not answer any questions he or she prefers not to answer.

Confidentiality of your child's research records will be strictly maintained by assigning codes to your child's responses which would prevent linking any responses to his/her identity. The data from the study will be kept until 5 years after publication, as recommended by the American Psychological Association, and then destroyed by shredding.
