## Parental/Guardian Permission Form for Department Pool Participants Earning Credit

Your child, \_\_\_\_\_, is invited to take part in a study named Internal Memos. The study is designed to learn more about intergenerational differences in the workplace. It is being conducted by Elizabeth Parks-Stamm, who is the principal investigator, as part of her graduate training. The faculty sponsor of this work is Professor Heilman, Psychology Department.

If you give permission for your child to be in this study, he/she will be asked to evaluate two internal memos from an organization. Your child's participation will take about 30 minutes and he or she will receive 1/2 credit for laboratory participation towards the course research requirement. When your child completes the study, a thorough verbal and written explanation of it will be given to him/her.

There are no known risks associated with your child's participation in this research beyond those of everyday life. Although your child will receive no direct benefits for participation in this study, it may make him or her more aware of how knowledge is discovered in psychology and help the investigator better understand intergenerational differences in the workplace.

Taking part in this study is voluntary. Not taking part or withdrawing after the study has begun will not affect your child's grade or academic standing in any way. If your child withdraws at any time, he or she will still receive the 1/2 credit offered for taking part. Your child has the right to skip or not answer any questions he or she prefers not to answer.

Confidentiality of your child's research records will be strictly maintained by using only random codes on the data not associated with your child's name. The data from the study will be kept until 5 years after publication, as recommended by the American Psychological Association, and then destroyed by shredding.
