Parental/Guardian Permission Form for Department Pool Participants Earning Credit

Your child, _____, is invited to take part in a study named It's Only Make-Believe. The study is designed to learn more about how imagination is connected to reaction times on the computer. It is being conducted by Heather Barry who is the principal investigator, as part of her doctoral dissertation. The faculty sponsor of this work is Prof. Gabriele Oettingen, Psychology Department.

If you give permission for your child to be in this study, he/she will be asked to: complete a visual imagery task and a computer task that measures reaction time. Your child's participation will take about half an hour, and he/she will receive 0.5 credit for laboratory participation towards the course research requirement. When your child completes the study, a thorough verbal and written explanation of it will be given to him/her.

There are no known risks associated with your child's participation in this research beyond those of everyday life. Although your child will receive no direct benefits for participation in this study, it may make him or her more aware of how knowledge is discovered in psychology and help the investigator better understand how imagination is connected to reaction times on the computer.

Taking part in this study is voluntary. Not taking part or withdrawing after the study has begun will not affect your child's grade or academic standing in any way. If your child withdraws at any time, no credit but also no penalty will be given. Your child has the right to skip or not answer any questions he or she prefers not to answer.

Confidentiality of your child's research records will be strictly maintained by not collecting any identifying information. The data from the study will be kept at least until 5 years after publication, as recommended by the American Psychological Association. When it is destroyed, this will be done by shredding paper and deletion of electronic media.
